Session 1: Girls Around the World

Goal: The Brownies have fun exploring how stories and games can link them to the wide world of girls – and how they belong to this wide world of girls, too!

Meeting 1:

- ✓ Girl Scout Brownie Adult Guide
- ✓ Girl Scout Brown Girls Around the World (Girls Book)
- ✓ Paper
- ✓ Markers
- ✓ Assorted art materials (Team Passport)
- ✓ Healthy Snack
- Opening Ceremony: A Circle of Adventure
 - Gather the girls and welcome them to this journey (A World of Girls)
 - Have girls' link arms and image they're forming a circle around the world. While still linked, have circle recite the Girl Scout Promise and the Girl Scout Law together
 - Then begin a brief discussion with points suggested on page 29 of the Girl Scout Brownie Adult Guide
- Introducing the Journey's Award
 - Explain to the girls that in this Journey they will earn four awards and point out the pictures of awards located on page 7 of the GIRLS side of their book (for more assistance follow script on page 29 of Adult Guide)
 - Hear a Story
 - Change a Story
 - Tell a Story
 - Better World for Girls!
- "Flying into Shali's Desert Home"
 - Read script in Girls Book on pages 6-17.
 - Once done reading have girls do activity on page 17 in GB. Have girls list the following:
 - Skills I share
 - Skills my friends share with me
- Team Passport
 - Have Brownies turn to page 39 in their *Girls* Book. Explain to them that they will be tracking all the awards they earn on their Passport Pages.

- Also invite girls to create a Team Passport, so that they can capture
 the story of the activities that participate in together along this
 journey. Lets girls know to be prepared next meeting to create the
 Team Passport.
- You may want to also explain what a passport is for girls who may not know.
- o For more information refer to page 30 in your Adult Guide.
- Snack Time!!
 - Take this time to talk to girls about healthy snacks options for future meetings.
 - Also take this time to talk to girls about food allergies.
 - Make a list of who has what allergies and keep in mind for future snacks.
 - o Enjoy your snack!!
- Clean up!
- Closing Ceremony: A Great Place!
 - Invite girls to have fun with poem (page 34 of Adult Guide) acting out the action words of the poem.
 - Have group stand together and each say a line from the poem, repeating all lines until everyone has had a turn.
 - Or girls can say the remaining lines in unison, and make up their own gestures.

Take Home Assignment: Have girls make or chose an item to place in their Team Passport box. Item should reflect their experiences all along the journey.

- Have girls follow along on pages 18-27 in Girls Book
- Favorite Girls
 - Have girls discuss some of their favorite characters. Have them think about the following:
 - Are they brave?
 - Are they strong?
 - Have girls fill out the activity on page 27 in their GB
 - What's best about my favorite girl characters
 - What's best about me
- Go all out for the Team Passport
 - Have Brownies decorate a box (either draw or cover box with a map(s) or postcards). Team Passport is intended to be very creative and a highly imaginative take on a passport
 - Then have girls fill it with items that they were told to bring last meeting.

- Snack Time!!
 - Healthy snack
- Clean Up!!
- Closing Ceremony
 - Have Brownies choose a closing ceremony to end their meeting

Meeting 3: SUPPLIES & RESOURCES

 - o Invite girls to come up with their own opening ceremony
- Games Around the Globe
 - Discuss with the Brownies games and how much fun they can be!

- Ask girls to name different games they like to play and explain why they like them. Once each girl has had a chance to share, invite the group to play *Banyoka* or *Cencio Mollo* (description on page 31 of *Adult Guide*)
- "Story Swapping with Lakti"
 - Follow the script on pages 28-38 in GB
 - After finish reading with the Brownies follow the activity on page 39 in the GB
- The Brownie Friends' Passport
 - Have girls look at page 40 in the GB
 - o Fill out the questions asked about the stories that were read
- Our Globe (or Map) of Girls
 - Show the girls a globe (or map) of the world and introduce them to the idea that they're connected to other girls in other countries all around the world.
 - o For more information refer to page 32 of Adult Guide
- Snack Time!!
- Clean Up!!
- Closing Ceremony
 - Have Brownies to come up with their closing ceremony to end this meeting

Meeting 4:

- ✓ Girl Scout Brownies Adult Guide
- ✓ Girl Scout Brownies Girls Around the World (Girls Book)
- ✓ Globe or world map
- ✓ Hummus
- ✓ Pita bread
- ✓ Cut vegetables for dipping
- ✓ Figs or Fig Newtons
- ✓ Computer with internet (optional, to show the WAGGGS Web site, see page 33 or Adult Guide)
- Opening Ceremony
 - Invite Brownies to come up with opening ceremony to begin meeting
- Girl Scout Around the World
 - Continue the mapping activity by asking the girls to point out other countries where they think Brownies might live.
 - If possible, show the girls the Web site of the World Association of Girls Guides and Girl Scouts (wagggs.org)

- For more information on activity refer to page 33 in Adult Guide.
- Flying into Shali's Desert Home
 - Get the Brownies talking about "Flying into Shali's Desert Home," the first story in their book
 - Then share some of the information about Jordan, at right, that you think will most interest the girls.
 - o Refer to page 33 of *Adult Guide* for more information
- Snack Time: Jordan's Refreshments
 - Bring out the hummus and pita bread and let the girls know that these are foods eaten in Jordan.
 - Also have a small discuss about the cookie's fig "jam" filling and let them know that Fig Newtons were named for the town of Newton, Massachusetts.
 - o Follow the script on page 34 in Adult Guide
- Clean Up!!
- Closing Ceremony: More Passport Fun with Stories!
 - Look back with the girls at all the ways they've learned that stories can be told :
 - Through games
 - A "passport"
 - Storybooks
 - Maps
 - Treats
 - Ask the group if they would like to add any more stories, or ways of telling stories, to their Team Passport
 - Encourage girls to have fun continuing to think about stories!

- Looking Ahead to Session Two
 - Next time, the girls will seek out clues for their Hear a Story Award. Revisit the award details on page 21 of the Adult Guide, along with "Stories + Their Clues" on page 8. Although clues aren't restricted to storybooks, you might plan to meet at a library. Or reach out to your Network together a selection of books, magazines, and other story sources to share at your meeting place. Review the lists on page 9, of the *Adult Guide*, for suggested stories that hold good clues.
- Optional Field Trip to Library
 - To prepare, visit the library and ask if the librarian would lead a discussion with the girls about clues in stories and how to find

- them. The librarian can likely gather various stories from the library's own collection for the girls to discuss and borrow.

- Optional Guest Speaker: A Story Expert
 - If a library visit isn't an option for your group, invite a librarian, book editor, author, or someone else familiar with children's stories to your meeting to talk with the Brownies about clues in stories, and to inspire them to find more clues on their own.

Session 2: Girls in Our World

Goal: The Brownies enjoy seeing how they already belong to so many circles, or "world," of girls and women. They go on to explore how stories about women and girls often hold clues about actions they can take to make the world a better place.

Meeting 5:

- ✓ Girl Scout Brownies Adult Guide
- ✓ Girl Scout Brownies A World of Girls (Girls Book)
- ✓ Art materials (Team Passport refer to list in session 1)
- ✓ Jump Ropes (six or seven)
- ✓ Mango Dip (ingredients for snack on pg 18 of GB)
- Opening Ceremony: Girls in My World
 - Invite the Brownies into a Friendship Circle and have them name one thing they like to do with other girls
 - After each girl has had a chance, ask them to think over what their sister Brownies have said and then go around the circle again, with each one saying:
 - I like to _____, too, just like (name of another Brownie)
- Team Passport
 - Remind girls that they decided to create their Team Passport, which will tell the story of their journey, and get them going on some additions for it, as they planned during the first session.

- Overlapping Worlds
 - Have the Brownies use all but one of the jump ropes on have to make large overlapping circles on the floor.
 - If enjoying the activity outdoors, they can instead draw overlapping chalk circles on blacktop
 - Then invite girls to pick up jump ropes and take turns jumping.
 - Encourage them to team up to create an easy jump rose song, or use a variation on a traditional chant
 - Chant and more details can be found on page 38 of the Adult Guide.
- Snack Time: Mango Dip
 - Serve the sweet and tangy mango dip. Directions for dip can be found on page 18 of the GB. (will need to be prepared before meeting)
- Clean Up!!
- Closing Ceremony
 - Have Brownies come up with their own closing ceremony to end meeting.

Meeting 6:

Supplies & Resources

- ✓ Girl Scout Brownies Adult Guide
- ✓ Girl Scout Brownies A World of Girls (Girl Book)
- √ Sheets of Paper
- ✓ Markers
- ✓ Index cards or slips of paper
- As Girls Arrive
 - Have adult or Cadette assistants team up with the Brownies to talk about story characters they may have thought about since the last time they gathered. Any girls who may not have thought about story character can get thinking about them now with the larger group.
- Opening Ceremony
 - Have girls come up with opening ceremony to begin today's meeting
- Me and My Girl Worlds
 - This activity helps the girls get a deeper understanding of their own worlds and the women and girls who are part of those worlds.
 - o To begin, give each girl a sheet of paper and markers

- Have girls draw a circle that takes up most of the paper, fold paper into quarters, and unfold the paper. The circle stands for your world.
- In each quarter of the circle, write or draw one of the groups of girls or women who are part of your world.
- After the girls have drawn their groups, invite each to choose one of them and explain what she likes about it and how she feels when she is with the group.

- Girl Worlds in Stories
 - Inform the girls on how there are girl worlds in stories, too, of course!
 - Pass out the index cards (or slips of paper) and have them write the names of a favorite character on one side and one word describing the character on the other side
 - For examples and more details on this activity refer to page 39 of the Adult Guide.

- Closing Ceremony

Meeting 7:

- ✓ Girl Scout Brownies Adult Guide
- ✓ Girl Scout Brownies A World of Girls (Girl Book)
- ✓ Photocopies of "Hear a Story, Find a Clue" (page 44 of Adult Guide)
- ✓ Healthy Snack
- Opening Ceremony
 - Encourage girls to choose an opening ceremony to begin the day's meeting
- Shali's Story: Finding Clues for Change
 - Refresh the girls memory of the story about Shali
 - Refer to pages 40-41 of the Adult Guide for more information
- More Story Clues All Around
 - Offer a few more examples of clues to be found in stories, using the stories listed on page 42 of the Adult Guide.
- Earning the Hear a Story Award
 - Gather brownies in a circle and congratulate the girls on being great clue finders!

- The information for this activity can be found on page 45 in the Adult Guide.
- Snack Time!!
- Clean Up!!
- Closing Ceremony
- Looking Ahead to Session 3
 - Call on your network to gather peppers of various shapes, sizes, colors and heat for the next session. Suggest that they also provide a healthful dip (such as a dip of pureed chickpeas, sweet red peppers, plain yogurt, and herbs to taste.)
- Keep the "4 Brownie Awards" Chart handy!

Session 3: From Story Clues to Story Change

Goal: The Brownies use their growing awareness about all that stories can teach us to explore how they can create new stories through their actions. They find that they have the power to make the world a better place!

Meeting 8:

- ✓ Girl Scout Brownies Adult Guide
- ✓ Set of index cards (each card should have words or phrases written on them refer to page 50 of *Adult Guide*)
- ✓ Healthy Snack
- Opening Ceremony: Our World of Girls
 - Gather Brownies in circle and invite each girl to name one new thing she has learned about the world of girls on this journey.
 - If they need a reminder you may want girls to look into their Team Passport or drop hints about stories they asked women in their families
 - For more information refer to page 49 of the Adult Guide
- Role –Playing Positive Change
 - Get Brownies thinking about their ability to create change in their worlds based on clues in stories

- Have girls, individually or in small groups, role-play what the girls in the stories faced and solved or made better
 - If group would rather draw, suggest they make a quick sketch of what the girl characters did
- As Brownies watch their sister Brownie role-play have them address the positive changes taking place in the lives of the girls in the stories
 - Guide girls to understand positive changes might make everyday lives of girls' better right in their own communities.
- Also look at the side bar for Role-Play Starter on page 49 of Adult Guide and refer to same page for more details on activity
- Two Story Relays
 - These two relay races get the girls up and about as they put words together to create stories
 - For relay 1, have two sets of cards each card holding one of the 14 words/phrases listed below
 - Make sure cards are mixed up
 - Also make sure there is a table at one end of the room and a cleared space for running
 - For relay 2, the girls will create a story from a set of words (any story that makes sense)
 - For more details of relay 1 and 2 refer to pages 50-51 of the Adult Guide

 - Invite girls to come up with their own closing ceremony to end the meeting

- ✓ Selection of peppers, both hot and sweet, in a variety of shapes, sizes, colors
- ✓ Team Passport

- Circle 'Round the Story
 - Gather Brownies in circle and follow script on page 52 in Adult Guide.

- Sweet, Spicy, Smooth and Bright
 - In stories and in real life, girls sometimes feel different in some ways from others. As a way for the Brownies to experience and appreciate diversity in the world, show them the peppers you've brought of various shapes, sizes, and colors, and degrees of spiciness.
 - Be sure not to lay out the peppers so that similar ones are next to each other.

- Remind girls of how Grandmother Elf's bookmobile is a fun feature of the stories in their book. Point them to the "Stories on the Go" section of page 16 in the WORLD side, which explains the history of bookmobiles and how they are used around the world
- Then ask the girls to think about an imaginary bookmobile that can travel around the world
- Guide the girls to generate a group list of the top 10 books for their bookmobile. Encourage them to stand up for any books they think should be included.

- Closing Ceremony: The Title of My Story
 - Give all the girls a chance to add to the Team Passport. Then gather them in a Brownie Circle and let them have fun with the chant on page 56 of the *Adult Guide*. They can start it softly and then say it progressively louder
